The first profile created by the FBI's Behavioral Science Unit (BSU) was used to catch Montana serial killer David Meirhofer in 1974. Agents Howard Teten and Patrick Mullany worked the case under the supervision of Robert Ressler. In June 1973, seven-year-old Susan Jaeger was kidnapped while camping with her family.
