### **Essentials of Clinical Immunology - Case Studies**

1. Shock is the inability of the circulatory system to supply cells

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with oxygen. 2. The heart fails to pump, loss of blood volume, dilation of blood vessels. 3. Increased heart rate, increased respiration, constriction of peripheral circulation, pale, cool skin. 4. When perfusion to organs cannot be restored.

Blood cultures yield bacteria or fungi in 20-40% of cases of severe sepsis (i.e., this case) and in 40-70% of cases of septic shock. If the lab manages to isolate and identify the causative agent, you will also want its sensitivity pattern.
