The past tense of To Be in English has two forms: WAS and WERE. To Be - Affirmative

The main rule is that for every verb in English, there is only one form of it in the past tense. (The exception is the Past tense of To Be , which has two forms: was and were) This is totally different from other languages such as Spanish, French, Italian etc. where you change the verb ending for every subject.

Past Tense in English - Grammar Rules

The form of the verb to be is am (contracted to 'm), is ('s) and are ('re) in the present tense and was/were in the past. To be is used as an auxiliary verb, to form continuous tenses and the passive, and as a main verb.

Definition of the simple past tense The simple past tense, sometimes called the preterite, is used to talk about a completed action in a time before now. The simple past is the basic form of past tense in English. The time of the action can be in the recent past or the distant past and action duration is not important.

When we use "to be" verbs as helping verb, the main verb must be in progressive tense (-ing form). Do not say: She is help me finish my project. Say: She is helping helping me with my project. With Past Participle: Use past participle "been" to indicate that whatever you are stating started in the past and continues into the present.

The past is used to describe things that have already happened (e.g., earlier in the day, yesterday, last week, three years ago). The present tense is used to describe things that are happening right now, or things that are continuous.

The past continuous tense is formed using the past tense of the verb to be (was/were) and the present participle verbs ending in '-ing'. These two tenses can be used together to indicate that an action happened while another was in progress.

The negative form of simple past tense with "To be" can be made by adding not after the verb (was or were). There's no contraction of the subject and verb (e.g. I was).

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
